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Dear Physician:

For diabetic footwear to be covered by Medicare and many other insurance plans, all applicable Medicare statutory and regulatory requirements must be met. Medicare requires a physical evaluation of the patient, and the following bullet points must be included in the <u>physician's chart note</u> (Medicare does not consider a letter part of the medical record). Please fax any Medicare compliant chart notes to our office.

The physician must document the following:

- 1. Management of the patient's diabetes, and
- 2. Foot exam within the past 6 months, and
- 3. Treatment of the patient's condition(s) requires the use of diabetic footwear, *and2*
- 4. Patient has <u>one or more of the following</u> as noted on the therapeutic shoe form (the physician must discuss one or more of the following conditions that exist within their chart notes):
- 5.
- a. Foot deformity
- b. Current or previous foot ulcerations
- c. Current or previous pre-ulcerative calluses
- d. Previous partial amputation of one or both feet or complete amputation of one foot
- e. Peripheral neuropathy with evidence of callus formation
- f. Poor circulation

*Effective 11/5/2020 an NP or PA working directly under the supervision of the MD/DO who manages the patient's diabetic care can evaluate the patient for diabetic management and fill out the CMN form for therapeutic footwear. The treating MD/DO will need to sign off on the notes and form to be valid.
